

Solidarity with Alfredo and with anarchist and revolutionari prisoners

In reintroducing and re-proposing today, April 2026, the mobilization in favor of Alfredo and the other anarchist and revolutionary prisoners it is well to be conscious of the mutated scenery of the general social reality and of the fact that the conditions of heavy emotional impact that Alfredo's hunger strike had provoked by strenuously fighting between life and death for more than 150 days, before stopping in order to avoid making himself a useless martyrdom, are not there anymore.

It is necessary to be conscious that as the anarchist movement, in all of its various and autonomous components, we were not able to reach such a strength as to impose to the State (of war) and to the commands of the Capital to go back to the infamous measures such as 41-bis and high security regimes. The void of the life sentence without parole against Alfredo, three years ago, is nevertheless a fact from which, even today, is possible to start again. Even with all of this, though, it would be a mistake to try today to start over the mobilization starting from the conviction that if the primary objective was not reached back then, today, for sure, proposing ourselves on the terrain of struggle and conflictuality will result to be as useless as it has been. It makes no sense to start any struggle and mobilization giving up before it has even started.

Besides, let's reason and reflect on the limits of yesterday's mobilization and the mutated conditions and general scenery, and let us try to get geared up and better organized without renouncing or taking even more steps backwards before we try every possible coherent tentative in order to result closer and closer to the comrades who were stripped of their freedom and more and more effective, corrosive and incisive in the struggles that await us.

For sure what lays in front of us are not times and deadlines that can be considered pleasing and comfortable, but staying home or in reverse risks to become even more damaging than to try and measure ourselves in endeavors that just look impossible. We need to do this further weakened by the terrible loss of Sara and Sandro who donated everything, including their young lives, coherent with their passion and the urgency to act and not willing to take even more defeatist silences about the hits of repression and terrorist action that the State and the Institutions inflict every day on the collectivities, on the poorest, the marginalized, the exploited, the wrecked and the oppressed.

Sara and Sandro, who are not here today, but about whom it cannot be said with certainty or lightness that things went down as the State or the Police Station tells us. A lot of things still need to be clarified so it is best to not let ourselves go and stay clear-minded and determined. The institution of this bourgeois democracy would be mistaken if they believed they can get away with it. The anarchist do not forget and the justice they aspire to with their truest feelings will make it so that the State's skunks servicing its worst atrocities will end up paying, and with interests, what they are cowardly and nefariously provoking against the movement, the community and the acting anarchist individualities.

And we need to do so keeping ourselves close to the comrades who bravely face and resist against the restrictive and coercive measures that the unfair, vulgar and authoritarian institution impose on us through "safety measures" and constant militarization of the social life. In every occasion, in every struggle, meeting, mobilization, reflection and proposal. We need to do so facing humbly and coherently what has been imposed on us by the State's apparatus, spread out on a 360 degrees range and everywhere; from the bureaucratic-administrative structures to the disciplinary and conditioning services, in schools and universities up until the economic

structures that always fatten up and keep themselves alive through corruption and clientelism, to the armed corps for the social control and repression, to all of the infrastructure of information and the propaganda which mystify and changes what happens in order to protect the privileges and interest of the class enemy.

Also the divisions, the arbitrary and not-provable accusations, the very debatable continuous practices and behaviors in order to affirm presumptuous truth, trionphalist tones that are unasked for in front of such modest things, disseminated arguing and continuously fractioning, to show ourselves weak and broken apart in front of the system of the state and reactionary apparatus.

It'd be nothing but good if comrades would bathe themselves in humbleness and would try to look themselves in the mirror, for something else than narcissism for once, asking themselves specific questions accordingly with what the current times impose on us rather than with the quirky fantasies in which everyone can, once in a while, fall into. And all of this with the intent of growing and making ourselves stronger and more efficient, not that of going towards suicide. With the occasion of those few lines of reflections, directed towards always new positive proposals for the movement and for the comrades, we want to point you towards the appointments that are being organized in Genova (Italy) for the next months and the rest of 2026.

These events are primarily, of course, intended for the local area itself—that is, Genoa and its surroundings—but they have been deliberately designed on a much broader scale to offer the movement, in all its diverse components, the opportunity and time for dialogue and a renewed sense of initiative, which are increasingly urgent and necessary.

This year the Libertary Library Ferrer of Genoa (Biblioteca Libertaria Francisco Ferrer di Genova) (1976_2026) celebrate its 50th year of life, even though we cannot possibly claim of activity, since unfortunately in this period of time the Library has faced in multiple occasions even some years in a row of inactivity, cause of the difficulties and the organizational limits of the movement and the comrades in Genova.

Now, we care very little if not nothing about anniversaries and celebrations.

More interesting and important, instead, are the appointments that are being organized around the occasion of the celebrations (don't come expecting much actual celebrating) and the frame of the 50th of the Library.

They are, starting from the first of those, the 1st International Anarchist Publishing Fair of Genova, from the 11th to the 14th of June 2026.

The Fair will take place in a square in the city center and will be an authorized event, with the assent of the municipal administration. Nothing compromising, but just because in Genova, lately, the comrades do not have the strength to guarantee the safety of a three days event held in a square. Sunday 14th we'll all be in the Library (phone: 010 9911643), from 10:30 on, to discuss, starting from the editors, periodicals and distributors, about the themes and problems of editions, journals and magazine in relationship with the new instruments of communication and publishing. This day, and only this one, is just for comrades' participation, not for the general public, curious and visitors.

On May 10, at 11 a.m. at the Library —where we'll have lunch together— will be held the 3rd preliminary national organizational meeting, in the historic gathering of Genoa's anarchists, at Piazza Embriaci 5, int. 13. Publishers, libraries, archives, documentation centers, periodicals, and

active solidarity funds of the anarchist movement, as well as all comrades who act consistently out of a sense of individual responsibility and who are willing to contribute concretely to the organization of the event(s), from Genoa and other locations are invited.

The final event, held before the fair under an even stricter timetable, will take place on May 31—another

Sunday at 11 a.m., once again in Genoa and at the Library.

Each year, the Library allocates 10% of the proceeds from its self-financing dinners and lunches to active solidarity funds; It is and remains a structure at the service of the struggles and of our comrades (particularly the younger generations) for research, studies, in-depth analysis, meetings, and the organization of initiatives. It collects, preserves, and promotes the history and memoirs of anarchists in the Genoa area and primarily in Liguria. It remains, and will remain, the headquarters of the autonomous anarchist movement and a heritage of the Italian-speaking anarchist movement. Finally, the Library is a member of and part of the international networks Rebal and ALN, open year-round on Wednesdays and Thursdays from 3:30 PM to 8:00 PM, except during the months of January and August.
